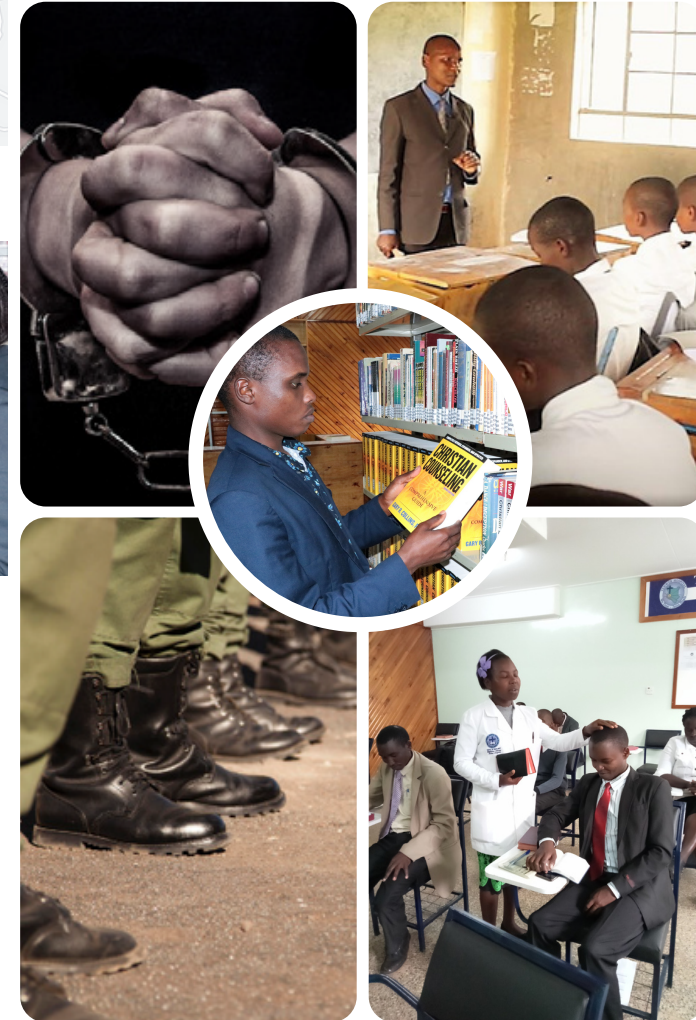


KEY AREAS OF TRAINING AND SERVICE

Our curriculum prepares students to specialize in areas of Chaplaincy:

- **Healthcare Chaplaincy**
Serving in environments of sickness, pain, birth, and death - including Hospital and Hospice Chaplaincy.
- **Military Chaplaincy**
Providing counseling and spiritual support for military personnel and families.
- **Police Chaplaincy**
Providing counseling and spiritual support for police officers, employees, and families.
- **Prison (or Correctional Ministry) Chaplaincy**
Supporting inmates, officers, and their families with counseling and spiritual care in prisons, borstal institutions (youth offenders), rehabilitation schools, and probation departments.
- **Educational Chaplaincy**
Serving the spiritual needs in educational institutions.
- **Corporate Chaplaincy**
This entails providing necessary spiritual support to companies, businesses and NGOs.

HISTORY

The Tenwek Hospital College School of Chaplaincy was established in 1991 as the L. Nelson Bell Chaplaincy Training School. Dr. Ernie Steury, the first doctor to serve at the hospital, realized that the institution needed a full-time chaplain to serve alongside the dedicated medical team.

Over 29 years later, the school has trained more than 200 students from various nations including Rwanda, Zambia, Zimbabwe, Malawi, Uganda, Tanzania, Ghana, Nigeria, Madagascar, and the Democratic Republic of Congo (DRC).

The Tenwek Hospital College ~ School of Chaplaincy is fully accredited by Technical and Vocational Education and Training Authority (TVETA). The Chaplaincy curriculum is examined by Kenya National Examination Council (KNEC). 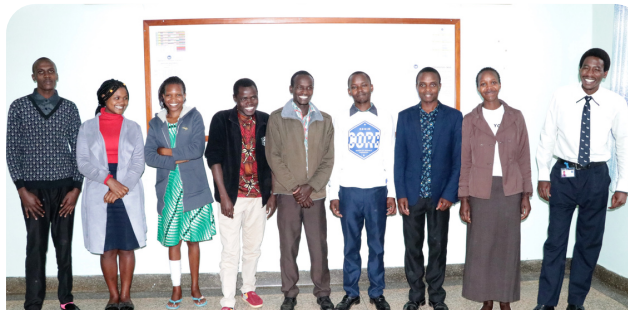
